# Message from the President: Marie-Josée Simard



In January last year our past president, François Tardif, ended his message by hoping that the 2020 summer would be a little bit more normal than the previous. Needless to say this summer was anything but normal. When we started to realise that the annual meeting might not be held in person, I remember mentioning to the Executive that the entire planet should quarantine for a few weeks, never imagining it would actually happen (asynchronously among nations, unfortunately). The covid pandemic came with multiple important challenges, especially for growers that rely on migrant workers to manage and harvest crops. Members who have families and small

businesses had to double their workloads and many still struggle as I write these lines. Those in universities were and are still not spared as field and lab activities were reduced and online courses are not easy to give and follow. Students miss out on all the social life associated with university curriculums. Those who nourish research ideas by strolling around research plots and fields with other colleagues, agronomists and producers were left with unsatisfied appetites. I myself experienced having to make cover crop planting decisions based on images sent by others, realizing afterwards the effect of image framing vs more holistic interpretations. We did get much better at virtual meetings and even parties, learning to unmute and leaving the camera on or off at the right time. Hopefully the scheduled vaccinations will bring back informal observations and discussions in the field and over coffee because we will need to find solutions to shortages in migrant workers that hoe crops, reductions in crop competitiveness generated by extreme weather events, shifting weed distributions in a warming climate and multiple herbicide resistance, to name a few.

Our 2020 online meeting was a success, thanks to my co-chair Martin Laforest, the Local Arrangements Committee and all the presenters who recorded their presentation, often for the first time. You can still watch all the presentations for a few months. Being able to listen to a talk more then once and watch all concurrent presentations does have advantages. As a board, we will have to decide what to do with the content and we will try to add additional online content (webinars etc.) for the membership. This year will again be different as we will not have a meeting in November but we will hopefully meet at the WSSA-CWSS joint meeting in Vancouver in February of 2022 thanks to our local arrangement co-chair Victoria Brookes and the WSSA co-chair (to be determined). We will have a second joint meeting in 2022 this time with the Canadian Society of Agronomy in Halifax to come back to our regular November schedule. I am sure everybody is anxious to meet in person and I look forward to our reunions. I do not believe the 2021 summer will be normal but I hope it will be less hectic.
