2022 CWSS-SCM Annual General Meeting



Registration is now open for the 2022 CWSS-SCM Annual General Meeting to be held jointly with the Canadian Society of Agronomy/ Société Canadienne d'Agronomie. Join us November 14th to 18th in Halifax, Nova Scotia! The theme of this year's meeting is "Precision Weed Management – From Promise to (Almost) Reality"

The conference organizers have developed an exciting program including graduate student presentations, concurrent oral and poster presentation sessions on weed management and agronomy, a workshop on statistical analyses and two symposia, one on precision agriculture and another on biomass crops. Gerald A. (Gerry) Mulligan

Gerald Alfred Mulligan passed away in Ottawa on the 27th of June 2022. Gerry was born in Ottawa, Ontario, in 1928. He received a B.Sc. in 1952 from Macdonald College at McGill. He joined the staff of the Weed Unit of the Botany and Plant Pathology Division of the Canadian Department of Agriculture in 1947 as an assistant technician.

Following the advice of his chief, Dr. Clarence Frankton, he left the unit to continue his education at Macdonald College, but returned each year for summer employment. On completion of his degree, he rejoined the division as a plant taxonomist. As a taxonomist and cytogeneticist Gerry was mainly concerned with weedy plants, particularly in the family Brassicaceae. He became an international authority on the taxonomy of the genera Physaria and Draba. In addition to many scientific papers on taxonomy, cytogenetics and reproduction systems, he authored such books as Common Weeds of Canada, contributed a chapter to the ground-breaking book The Genetics of Colonizing Species (1965), and was a coauthor of the second volume of The Flora of the Queen Charlotte Islands (1968), which dealt with the cytology of the plants of that archipelago. He produced many popular publications on weeds and poisonous plants, including the web pages that are at https://weedscanada.ca/. He was instrumental in establishing the series Biology of Canadian Weeds, which is being published in the Canadian Journal of Plant Science, and has edited two volumes in which the contributions to this series were brought together. Gerry's field work has taken him from Gaspé Peninsula in Quebec to British Columbia and south into the United States.

In 2006 he was awarded the George Lawson Medal by the Canadian Botanical Association and in 2014 he was awarded the Most Distinguished Alumni Award from his alma mater. Although he retired in 1987, Gerry continued to work and publish up until 2021 and was a valued colleague and friend to many.


