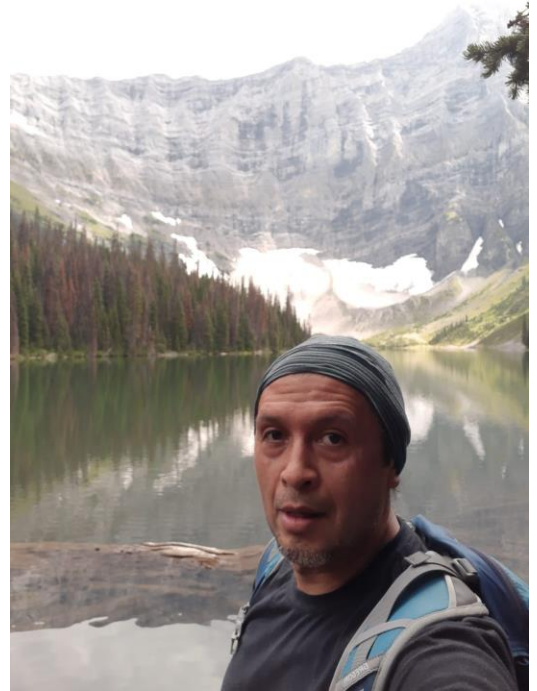
Occupation: Research Scientist at the Canadian Food Inspection Agency in Ottawa

Previous work and volunteer experience in Weed Science:

I started working on Invasive and Noxious Weeds as part of my job with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency as a Research Scientist. In my lab we do weed genomics and molecular biology to be able to identify regulated species and future threats to the Canadian economy and our food supply.

I became a member of the society in 2022 and came to the CWSS meeting in Halifax.

I recently became part of the board as Research Representative / Scholarship and Awards Chair.

What is your favourite weed and why?

My career in weed science has not been long (I used to, and still dedicate part of my research to plant pathology), but we have been studying *Amaranthus palmeri*, and I would say it is exciting research just because of the extent of the impact this plant can have on our crops.

Help position weed omics as a central component of research in Canada, to aid in more efficient diagnostics and management decisions.
